Commercial Vehicle Inspection Program Outline

Introduction

This course is required for journey person mechanics wanting to become certified as Commercial Motor Vehicle Inspectors. This 3-day course will include two days of theory and one day of practical.

Prerequisites include Certificate of Qualification (TQ#), or Red Seal status in Commercial Transport Mechanical Repair, Commercial Transport Trailer Repair, Heavy Duty Mechanical Repair or Automotive Repair Trades.

Apprentices who have reached level four in any of the above trades can also participate in the course but will not receive their Inspectors Certificate until they become certified mechanics.

Participants receive Authorized Inspectors Certification upon successful completion of the course.

Course Content

This course will cover the following content:

- Classes of motor vehicles,
- Motor Vehicle Act and Regulations,
- Designated Inspection Facility Program,
- Preventative Maintenance Program,
- Inspector Qualifications and Responsibilities,
- Responsibilities of Facility Operators and Inspectors,
- Commercial Vehicle Inspection manual,
- Procedures for forms completion and decal application,
- Vehicle Inspection e-forms general procedures and how to sign up,
- Preparation and administration of Authorized Inspectors examination,

NOTE: CSA approved safety glasses and footwear is required during the practical portion of the course. Footwear must be steel-toed leather, ankle covering boots.
