Air Brake Instructor Certification

A Provincial Government Approved Course

This ICBC approved program is designed to give participants the knowledge to effectively prepare and deliver an air brake course.

The course concentrates on instructional methods and technical content for air brake systems.

Course content includes topics of instructional procedures such as lesson plans, coaching, effective teaching techniques, questioning techniques and developing multiple choice questions.

Technical content includes topics on the basic air brake system, dual air brake system, trailer air brake systems, brake adjustment and air brake valves.

Each student is given an opportunity for "hands on" experience in assembling and instruction using a fully operational air brake board. The air brake board has fully interchangeable

components and is capable of simulating all types of air brake systems.

Each student is required to develop and present two 45 minute presentations to the class. Topics will be on air brake systems and the instructor will allocate the topics on the first day of class.

Each student must obtain 80% on each presentation to pass the course. An informational entrance exam is given on the first day and a final theory exam is given at the end of the week. Each participant must obtain 80% on the final theory exam to be successful.

Each student is given a "Driving Commercial Vehicles" handbook, a course manual which includes technical information and Provincial And Federal air brake regulations.

Commercial Vehicle Inspection Program

Provincial Government recognized Certification Course upon successful completion

This course is required for journey person mechanics wanting to become certified as Commercial Motor Vehicle Inspectors.

Due to recent changes implemented by CVSE, a practical portion is now required to be included with the CVIP course. This 3-day course will include two days of theory and one day of practical.

Prerequisites include Certificate of Qualification (TQ#) or Red Seal status in Commercial Transport Mechanical Repair, Commercial Transport Trailer Repair, Heavy Duty Mechanical Repair or Automotive Repair Trades.

Apprentices who have reached level three or four in any of the above trades can also participate in the course but will not receive their Inspectors Certificate until they become certified mechanics.

Participants are eligible to receive Authorized Inspectors Certification upon successful completion of the course.

This course will cover the following content:

- Classes of motor vehicles,
- Motor Vehicle Act and Regulations,
- Designated Inspection Facility Program,
- Preventative Maintenance Program,
- Inspector Qualifications and Responsibilities
- Responsibilities of Facility Operators and Inspectors
- Commercial Vehicle Inspection manual
- Procedures for forms completion and decal application
- Vehicle Inspection e-forms general procedures and how to sign up. reparation and administration of Authorized Inspectors examination.

NOTE: CSA approved safety glasses and footwear is required during the practical portion of the course. Footwear must be steel-toed leather, ankle covering boots.

Standard Of Care

This course is for the driver who operates a heavy commercial vehicle, as well as supervisors and fleet managers. If you drive for a company or organization as part of or all of your occupation, the law considers you to have a greater 'Standard of Care' to drive safely and defensively.

'Standard of Care' is a legal term that establishes minimum standards. Similar to malpractice, it's the same reference to a professional who demonstrates negligence by an act or omission in which care provided has deviated from accepted standards of practice, and causes injury or death to someone.

Bill C-45 has created corporate criminal liability. Bill C-45 has established a specific section within criminal negligence that imposes criminal liability upon an organization. As a result, directors, managers, supervisors and other persons in authority within an organization can be charged criminally. An organization must take reasonable steps to prevent bodily harm to employees and/or any other persons arising from work conducted by the

organization.

C-45 is federal legislation that amended the Canadian Criminal Code and became law in March 2004.

This course discusses key issues for today's professional driver and communicates the main relationship between professional driving, professional driver training, and the law. The session calls on clients to: recognize their criminal, civil, and corporate obligations; operate safely; understand driving myths about behavior and attitude; and advance driver education.

Topics include:

- Importance of professionalism and attitude towards driving
- High-risk behaviors such as: unsafe speed, non-use of seat-belts, distraction
- Driving as an Art rather than an Act—with reference to visual search patterns
- Vehicle dynamics: kinetic energy, braking-steering-acceleration, and rollover stability
- Tire and road surface considerations
- Incident examples

"Standard of Care"

refers to drivers as well as their supervisors and can apply to on and off-duty situations.

Commercial Vehicle Cargo Securement

This program is designed for Fleet and Safety Managers, as well as all commercial vehicle operators, as per the new *Load Securement Standard* under schedule 10 of the National Safety Code. This course will equip managers and operators with the necessary skills to secure loads according to current regulatory requirements and industry "best practices".

ALL cargo being transported on the highway system must remain on or within the transporting vehicle under all conditions which could reasonably be expected to occur in normal driving, and when a driver is responding to emergency situations, short of a crash.

Know how to properly secure the load.

Know that your fleet is in compliance and drivers & equipment are legal

Your Greatest Risk

This course is an awareness and information presentation which speaks to the risks inherent to driving. The presentation connects the relationship between individual due diligence, vicarious liability and bill C-45.

The presentation shows the statistical information which supports the fact that operating a motor vehicle or piece of equipment is a person's greatest risk for serious injury and death both in and out of the work place. Frequency, Exposure and Severity are reviewed relative to driving.

Many case studies are reviewed to support the need for all drivers to assess their own driving ability and to make changes to their driving behavior to lessen the exposure.

Bill C-45 has established a specific section within criminal negligence that imposes criminal liability upon an organization. As a result, directors, managers, supervisors and other persons in authority within an organization can be charged criminally. An organization must take reasonable steps to prevent bodily harm to employees and/or any other persons arising from work conducted by the organization.

C-45 is federal legislation that amended the Canadian Criminal Code and became law in March 2004.

The highly informative session often leads to enlightening discussion with regard to current and local issues, with specific reference to recent court rulings in company litigation cases. Specific issues can be emphasized within the presentation in order to customize the material for forestry, oil and gas, transportation, motor coach, municipal government, etc.

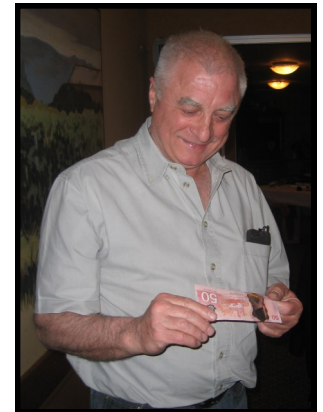

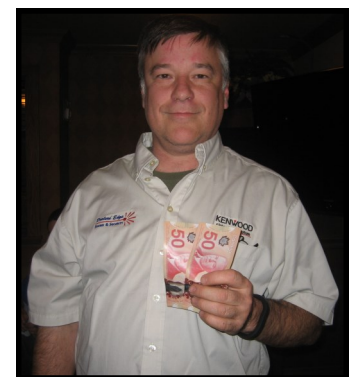
